This ammunition was tested in a Bushmaster M-4 variant, from standing and standing supported positions. Due to the weather conditions at the time, ballistic gel could not be used, however it was fired into frozen 20 ounce water bottles and 20 ounce unfrozen water bottles.

A very versatile round. Heavy enough to penetrate and not deflect, yet the design allows for rapid expansion on soft tissue.

This round did not seem to perform as well as the 62 grain 5.56mm round, which may be due to the use of a 5.56mm firearm versus a .223cal firearm.

I tested the Hornady 223 REM 62 grain BARRIER ammunition. TAP (Tactical Application Police), is Hornady's line of law enforcement ammunition.

Upon receipt of the ammo I took it out of the box and insured there were no deficiencies. There were no dents, scrapes or blemishes and the primers appeared to be in good condition.

At the range, I used a Colt M-4 with iron sights and a standard military issue magazine, filled with twenty rounds. The ammunition fed into the rifle fine, there were no jams or stoppages. The ammunition held about 3/4 of a minute of angle accuracy. Unfortunately I was not able to do any penetration tests with barriers.

As far as cleaning of the rifle, I didn't notice a difference between the Hornady ammunition and the ammunition I normally use.

I was confident in the ammunition I tested and would feel comfortable using it operationally.
